Terms and Definitions

Exposure

Close contact to COVID-19 occurs when you are within six feet of someone for at least 15 minutes who within 48 hours tests positive for the coronavirus. This is considered exposure regardless of whether one or both parties were wearing a mask and whether or not the infected person is exhibiting symptoms.

Policies

Exposure

If an individual student or staff member is exposed to COVID-19 as defined above, then they are required to quarantine for 14 days after the last contact with the infected person.

If an individual tests positive, they must isolate for 10 days.

Depending on the situation, the school Administrator may assign a specific return date for an individual.

Staff members in quarantine are required to remain home for the duration of their 14 days, or until they receive permission from the school Administrator.

Staff members will be paid during their first quarantine period. However, if a staff member has to be quarantined following the first incident, then they will use personal time accrued if applicable.

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19

Preschool Four-Year Olds:

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, the exposed class will quarantine for 14 days.

In this case the students will receive learning packets and will also receive instruction twice a day from their teacher via google meets.

Payments will still be required from parents during quarantine.

Teachers will still be required to prepare, teach, and grow in educational development during this time.

Preschool Two and Three-Year Olds:

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, the exposed class will quarantine for 14 days.

In this case the students will receive learning packets but will not receive academic instruction.

Payments will be made at a 50% discount from parents during the first quarantine periods.

Teachers will be required to prepare materials for take-home packets and to participate in continued educational activities. Teachers will receive full pay for the first period and must use personal time quarantine incidents occurring thereafter. However, teachers are not required to participate in continued educational activities during the periods in which they are quarantined and using personal days.

K-8 School

If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19 in the K-8 School, the exposed class will quarantine for 14 days.

In this case the students will receive learning virtually through google classroom.

Payments will still be required from parents during quarantine.

Teachers will still be required to prepare, teach, and grow in educational development during this time. For this reason all teachers must be prepared to use Google Meets and Google Classroom.

Masks

Masks are optional. However, everyone who opts out of wearing a mask on the property must sign the "Opt-Out Form" from the office and return it to the office. Students and faculty that do not sign an "Opt-Out Form" must wear a mask while on school property or while participating in school activities.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Preschool

Preschool students will be dropped off and picked up at the preschool door located between the gymnasium and the Church. Parents will not enter the building unless special permission is granted.

K-5

K-5 students will be dropped off and picked up at the lower entrance in front of the school office. Parents will not enter the building unless special permission is granted.

Middle School

Middle School students will be dropped off and picked up at the upper entrance in front of the church. Parents will not enter the building unless special permission is granted.
